



With support from Voluntary Aco n Rotherham the group were able to:


- Buy iPads and access free digital training

- Purchase insurance



Michelle Scholey from Pay it Forward in VAR came in person to see this event, which would never have happened without their support and encouragement for us.




Rotherham Gismo, Rotherham's online directory of voluntary and community groups is launched
